

FAQ's (frequently asked questions)

- 1. Do I have to be a church member in order for my child to participate in LOGOS?** No.
- 2. Do I have to be a resident of Richmond in order for my child to participate in LOGOS?** No.
- 3. May my child bring a guest?** Yes, provided you complete a guest form no later than 10:00 a.m. the Friday before visiting, and pay \$10 for their participation.
- 4. Do you provide transportation?** No; however, for Richmond Grade School, we provide two adult walkers to meet the children after school and safely escort them to the church. Please fill out the appropriate permission slip, provided in this packet, and turn in to the school.
- 5. Is scholarship help available?** Limited scholarships are available. Please see Director Jean Valsa.
- 6. When are fees due?** Wednesday before each quarter begins.
- 7. May I do a payment plan?** We are sorry, we are not equipped for that; however, you may take advantage of our “ala carte” option and pay per visit. Please see the “Fees” form.
- 8. What if my child arrives late?** Your child will join in the program wherever it is at that point. Because there are five parts in the sequence, please make effort to be on time, so your child will feel comfortable.
- 9. What can I do to help?** There are lots of ways for parents to volunteer and we welcome your participation. Please see the “Parent Participation” form.
- 10. What if I am late to pick up my child?** LOGOS staff will wait with your child until 7:30 p.m. If you must be late, please call 815-678-6521. This will relieve your child and help staff plan.
- 11. Is this a Safe Church environment?** Yes. Please see the “Policies and Procedures” form.
- 12. Is child care provided for children younger than LOGOS age (5 and younger)?** Yes, child care is available during the dates and times you are scheduled to volunteer.
- 13. What about my special needs child?** Our capability and facility are limited. Please see Director Jean Valsa to discuss your situation.
- 14. What is Welcome Time?** A time where children get acquainted with friends and staff while a light snack is served. This is an opportunity for children to relax and wind down after school. Children may participate in quiet games or finish any homework they may have.
