SCRIPTURE READING

The Gospel according to Luke 1:26-38 (NRSV)

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ## CELEBRATION OF HOLY COMMUNION

### Invitation

*A story is told that during the Blitz in World War II Britain, when the city was bombed relentlessly, Operation Pied Piper evacuated many children to the country, but some remained in London and many of those were orphans. Some were sheltered in a Jesuit order of brothers, who noticed the children had trouble falling asleep or staying asleep, night after night. When the children were being put to bed one night, one of the brothers guessed the children's problem was that they were anxious because of uncertainty in their lives, and gave each child a small piece of bread, saying something like this – "Hold on to your piece of bread while you are sleeping. Remember when you woke up this morning, we fed you and took care of you. When you wake up tomorrow, and we will be here for you. Let the bread remind you of this. Good night, children." The children slept.*

*Come now, to be comforted in the story of Bethlehem, which means "House of Bread."  
Come to be comforted at this table by a handful of bread and a cup of love, that will stay with you always.*

### Words of Remembering

O, we remember and give thanks that God is our Maker, and we are the sheep of God's pasture. We remember that through prophets and disciples, from the ancient times, God has promised "Emmanuel," which is "God with us," and a branch of new life from Jesse's root; promised a Leader, Wisdom, Monarch, Key of all that is locked, and Dawn of every morning.

We remember that no storm, no rebellion, no sin could cause God to take back that promise. And we remember the sacred story, that happened in Bethlehem, for a new mother and a fostering father, sheep and shepherds, a few wise travelers with gifts, and many, many angels. And we remember that the baby named Jesus, grew up to heal people, and teach them with strange parables, that made them angry.

At Passover he broke unleavened bread and shared it, that his very being might become a dwelling place for us all;  
he poured wine and love freely, inviting them all to share in the new covenant of his life and love,  
so that all may live in peace, and be comforted,  
and be led forth in peace, and also hope and joy and love.

Prayer of Consecration – Place your hands over the bread and cup you have before you as you pray:

**Emmanuel, God with us,  
in our lonely nights, under our guiding stars,  
with the hopes and fears of all our years,  
we come for comfort,  
for peace of mind and peace on earth,  
for a blessing on our hands and the bread in them,  
on our lips and the cup we lift to it.  
May this bread and cup be your holy Life, that we may ponder in our hearts,  
as we pray in our community ...**

**Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.**

## **WHAT ABOUT THAT CONGREGATIONAL SURVEY?**

To date, we've had 31 responses to the congregational survey, which has covered a wide range of our active congregation members. Here are some of the results and trends:

74% of people who responded are worshipping online with us a few times a month or more, and mostly doing so at the live worship time of 10:00 on Sundays.

In response to what's made online worship meaningful, most answers related to seeing the sanctuary, including multiple people and voices in worship, and chatting with others in the comments during worship.

77% of those who responded are still feeling 'connected' or 'very connected' to the church and its mission.

In response to the question about our individual intentions to return to in-person worship, we pretty much came down 50/50 on whether we expect to return as soon as such worship is offered or not.

As far as when we think in-person should be offered again, we understandably have a range of thoughts: Many people are looking toward a trusted vaccine (33%) or a time when we can all worship together without restrictions based on age or health (22%). 9% of those who responded do believe we should be worshipping in-person now.

There is moderate interest in in-person fellowship or Spiritual Growth gatherings.

In response to what one thing we should make happen for our church in the coming months, our desire is to find safe ways to gather in-person, either by allowing small groups into worship (49%) or other in-person small groups (32%).

In terms of other things you wanted us to know: Connecting to online worship is feeling particularly difficult for families with children of all ages as well as for a small handful of folks who just don't connect well via the screens – keep those families and folks in your prayers, and if there's someone that you haven't "seen" in church lately, it would mean so much if you would give them a call or write them a note.

The strong majority of our congregation is able to keep a sense of connection through what we're offering, and I'm grateful that is the case. Continue to hold our congregation in prayer, that we might know God is with us, and that we might, even in these strange, hard times, share God's love outside of

our immediate community. Thanks for your time and honesty in replying to this survey; it helps me have a much better feel for how we're doing.

### SO, WHAT'S NEXT?

For right now, we will keep on keeping on. The Illinois Conference of the United Church of Christ is strongly urging churches to remain at or return to online-only services for the foreseeable future. With positivity rates as they are in McHenry Co and surrounding areas, even very small gatherings are very likely to involve people who are positive with COVID-19. We do not expect to hold any in-person services in December, including for Christmas Eve. I find that hard to say, even though I've been expecting it for months, and even though I firmly believe it is the wise and faithful thing to do. I, and the Worship & Spiritual Growth Ministry, are working hard to provide meaningful December opportunities for you through worship, fellowship, and at-home experiences; I hope you will take advantage of them.

We are talking about how to begin allowing a very small number of people to be in the sanctuary during worship, though I don't expect that to begin before mid-January at the earliest. In the meantime, now that I'm increasing my worship technology skills, I'll continue to try to involve different people in worship leadership, so that we connect with each other that way. And, as always, I'm open to other ideas and conversation.
