SCRIPTURE READING

Paul's Letter to Romans 8:31-39

If God is for us, who is against us? God who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will God not also with the Son give us everything else? Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. So who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered."

But no, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

SCRIPTURE READING

The Acts of the Apostles 15:1-1-22, 30-31 (CEB)

The apostles and the elders gathered to consider this matter. After much debate, Peter stood and addressed them, “Fellow believers, you know that, early on, God chose me from among you as the one through whom the Gentiles would hear the word of the gospel and come to believe. God, who knows people’s deepest thoughts and desires, confirmed this by giving them the Holy Spirit, just as he did to us. He made no distinction between us and them, but purified their deepest thoughts and desires through faith. Why then are you now challenging God by placing a burden on the shoulders of these disciples that neither we nor our ancestors could bear? On the contrary, we believe that we and they are saved in the same way, by the grace of the Lord Jesus.”

The entire assembly fell quiet as they listened to Barnabas and Paul describe all the signs and wonders God did among the Gentiles through their activity. When Barnabas and Paul also fell silent, James responded, “Fellow believers, listen to me. Simon reported how, in his kindness, God came to the Gentiles in the first place, to raise up from them a people of God. The prophets’ words agree with this; as it is written,

After this I will return, and I will rebuild David’s fallen tent; I will rebuild what has been torn down. I will restore it so that the rest of humanity will seek the Lord, even all the Gentiles who belong to me. The Lord says this, the one who does these things known from earliest times.

Therefore, I conclude that we shouldn’t create problems for Gentiles who turn to God. Instead, we should write a letter, telling them to avoid the pollution associated with idols, sexual immorality, eating meat from strangled animals, and consuming blood. After all, Moses has been proclaimed in every city for a long time, and is read aloud every Sabbath in every synagogue.”

The apostles and the elders, along with the entire church, agreed to send some delegates chosen from among themselves to Antioch, together with Paul and Barnabas. They selected Judas Barsabbas and Silas, who were leaders among the brothers and sisters....

When Barnabas, Paul, and the delegates were sent on their way, they went down to Antioch. They gathered the believers and delivered the letter. The people read it, delighted with its encouraging message.

COME TO OUTDOOR WORSHIP!

- June 13 and June 20, weather-permitting.
- Bring your own lawn chair and your mask.
- We'll gather on the west lawn – NOT where we've had outdoor worship before but on the lawn closest to West Ave, near the entrance to the office wing of the building.
- We won't have the large tent that we've used before, but it is acceptable to bring your hat, your sunglasses, your sun parasol, etc.
- Wear your mask from your car until everyone is settled at the start of worship. Once everyone is seated and worship begins, Pastor Hope will give us permission to unmask (if we want to) while we remain seated during worship. We will put our masks on again at the end of worship before we move around again.
- Take yourself/your household to one of the marked spaces on the lawn. Greet your church friends from a distance, but please don't hug or handshake for now.
- Try not to go into the building. It will be unlocked, and restrooms are available, but we want as little traffic into the building as possible.
- We do still plan to livestream worship on these days, so you can attend online if you're more comfortable that way.
