The Acts of the Apostles 16:16-34

Once when we were going to the place of prayer, we were met by a female slave who had a spirit by which she predicted the future. She earned a great deal of money for her owners by fortune-telling. She followed Paul and the rest of us, shouting, “These men are servants of the Most High God, who are telling you the way to be saved.” She kept this up for many days. Finally Paul became so annoyed that he turned around and said to the spirit, “In the name of Jesus Christ I command you to come out of her!” At that moment the spirit left her.

When her owners realized that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace to face the authorities. They brought them before the magistrates and said, “These men are Jews, and are throwing our city into an uproar by advocating customs unlawful for us Romans to accept or practice.”

The crowd joined in the attack against Paul and Silas, and the magistrates ordered them to be stripped and beaten with rods. After they had been severely flogged, they were thrown into prison, and the jailer was commanded to guard them carefully. When he received these orders, he put them in the inner cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.

About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everyone’s chains came loose. The jailer woke up, and when he saw the prison doors open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself because he thought the prisoners had escaped. But Paul shouted, “Don’t harm yourself! We are all here!”

The jailer called for lights, rushed in and fell trembling before Paul and Silas. He then brought them out and asked, “Sirs, what must I do to be saved?”

They replied, “Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved—you and your household.” Then they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all the

SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL: Lead Summer Sunday School – As we're trying to get back to more of our regular offerings around church, we ask for your help in supporting Summer Sunday School. Our focus over the summer is simply on the chance for the children and some grown-ups they might not normally spend time with to have a little fun in the name of Jesus.

Teachers sign up for one Sunday at a time and are encouraged to choose an activity they would enjoy doing with the kids. Make a craft. Or take the kids outside to color the sidewalks with messages of love. Play them a bit of a movie or a VeggieTales story (suggestions available from Pastor Hope) while they do some coloring. Make a simple snack or cookies with them downstairs in the church kitchen. Teach them about knitting or braiding or teach them something about the plants outside the church building or about some other interest of yours. Read them a favorite Bible story, or teach them one of your favorite church songs (Play it for them on Youtube if you don't want to sing it!). The idea is just for some grown-ups of the church to spend some time with some children of the church doing something they enjoy.

PENTECOST IS COMING – You might remember that we like to make a joyful festival on Pentecost, the celebration of the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples in Jerusalem and energizing them for their gospel mission. Pentecost this year is June 5. Because the color RED is traditionally associated with the Holy Spirit, on this day, you're encouraged to wear red, and to bring a red candle that we can place on the table up front and light during worship. New this year, we also invite you to bring a red food to share with the food pantry – try to think along the lines of tomato sauce, spaghetti sauce, Spaghetti O's... not just red candy. 😊

We'll also celebrate the work of the Spirit among our congregation that day: Who's service to this church are you particularly grateful for these days? Think about it and watch for the how the Spirit is moving among us in these next weeks before Pentecost.
