**WE LISTEN TO THE WORD OF GOD**

SCRIPTURE READING The Gospel according to John 6:66-69

Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him. So Jesus asked the twelve, “Do you also wish to go away?” Simon Peter answered him, “Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God.”

SCRIPTURE READING The Prophet Jeremiah 36:1-8,21-23,27-28

In the fourth year of King Jehoiakim son of Josiah of Judah, this word came to Jeremiah from the Lord: Take a scroll and write on it all the words that I have spoken to you against Israel and Judah and all the nations, from the day I spoke to you, from the

days of Josiah until today. It may be that when the house of Judah hears of all the disasters that I intend to do to them, all of them may turn from their evil ways, so that I may forgive their iniquity and their sin.

Then Jeremiah called Baruch son of Neriah, and Baruch wrote on a scroll at Jeremiah's dictation all the words of the Lord that he had spoken to him. And Jeremiah ordered Baruch, saying, "I am prevented from entering the house of the Lord; so you go yourself, and on a fast day in the hearing of the people in the Lord's house you shall read the words of the Lord from the scroll that you have written at my dictation. You shall read them also in the hearing of all the people of Judah who come up from their towns. It may be that their plea will come before the Lord, and that all of them will turn from their evil ways, for great is the anger and wrath that the Lord has pronounced against this people." And Baruch son of Neriah did all that the prophet Jeremiah ordered him about reading from the scroll the words of the Lord in the Lord's house.

... Then the king sent Jehudi to get the scroll, and he took it from the chamber of Elishama the secretary; and Jehudi read it to the king and all the officials who stood beside the king. Now the king was sitting in his winter apartment (it was the ninth month), and there was a fire burning in the brazier before him. As Jehudi read three or four columns, the king would cut them off with a penknife and throw them into the fire in the brazier, until the entire scroll was consumed in the fire that was in the brazier.

... Now, after the king had burned the scroll with the words that Baruch wrote at Jeremiah's dictation, the word of the Lord came to Jeremiah: Take another scroll and write on it all the former words that were in the first scroll, which King Jehoiakim of Judah has burned.

## **UPDATES FROM CABINET**

The Church Cabinet met last Monday evening. We had discussion about continuing to work with the new camera in the sanctuary to get it cooperating with our keyboard and sound system, and discussed hiring someone to complete that set-up if our next few ideas don't resolve the issues. We heard updates about fellowship and youth education events, past and upcoming, as well as some updates about caring for the building. We ended the month with just over \$36,000 in our main bank account and about \$161,000 in our other non-endowment investment accounts.

## **BIBLE BACKGROUND**

Last week, we started the prophet Jeremiah's story in about the year 627 BCE. God called him "to Judah and to the nations... to pluck up and to pull down, to destroy and to overthrow, to build and to plant." Now it's close to the year 600. The power of the Babylonian empire has gotten greater and, though they don't exactly know it yet, the small nation of Judah is only a few years from suffering its first heart-crushing exile experience (which happened in 597 BCE). Jeremiah has given his warnings through a couple kings now. What does he warn them? Not to trust in their own political or military efforts. (He actually says they should submit to being an occupied nation rather than trying to rebel or fight off the Babylonians. Of course, they don't like that proposal.)
