WORD FOR ALL AGES – Samuel the priest thought that Hannah sounded “silly” when she prayed for a child. SCRIPTURE READING I Samuel 1:9-11, 19-20; 2:1-10 (NRSV)

After they had eaten and drunk at Shiloh, Hannah rose and presented herself before the Lord. Now Eli the priest was sitting on the seat beside the doorpost of the temple of the Lord. She was deeply distressed and prayed to the Lord, and wept bitterly. She made this vow: "O Lord of hosts, if only you will look on the misery of your servant, and remember me, and not forget your servant, but will give to your servant a male child, then I will set him before you as a Nazirite until the day of his death. He shall drink neither wine nor intoxicants, and no razor shall touch his head."

... They rose early in the morning and worshiped before the Lord; then they went back to their house at Ramah. Elkanah knew his wife Hannah, and the Lord remembered her. In due time Hannah conceived and bore a son. She named him Samuel, for she said, "I have asked him of the Lord."

Our Part in the Story: Devotions on Sunday's Text

God Answers Hannah

1 Samuel 1:9-11, 19-20; 2:1-10

- ❖ Have you ever made a vow or deal to gain something in return? What was the result?
- ❖ When do you pray? What do your prayers include? Have your prayers ever been answered?
- ❖ Samuel's name has a very special meaning. Do you know what your name means?
- ❖ What other biblical songs can you think of? Which is your favorite?
- ❖ Hannah's prayer points out amazing reversals God enacts: "The strong become weak and the weak become strong." What other reversals in God's work can you describe?

Daily Readings

These readings span the story between this Sunday's text and next Sunday's. Read a different text each day, and consider how it relates to Sunday's lesson and to your daily experiences.

Monday: Samuel's Calling 1 Samuel 3:1-20

- ❖ What do you think Eli was thinking after Samuel came to him for the third time?

Tuesday: Samuel as Judge 1 Samuel 7:3-17

- ❖ For what do you cry out to the Lord?

Wednesday: Israel Demands a King 1 Samuel 8:1-18

- ❖ What problems did the Israelites think would be solved by a king?

Thursday: Samuel Anoints Saul 1 Samuel 9:15-17, 27; 10:1

- ❖ Anointing is a special ritual of blessing. Have you ever been anointed? For what purpose? What does the ritual mean to you?

Friday: Saul's Unlawful Sacrifice 1 Samuel 13:1-14

- ❖ Why do you think Saul made the sacrifice, which was inappropriate for him to do?

Saturday: Saul Rejected As King 1 Samuel 15:10-31

- ❖ Why did Samuel not accept Saul's penance? Why does God seem to give some people more chances than others?
